

Master of Education (M.Ed.) Curriculum and Instruction

Claflin University's M.Ed. in Curriculum and Instruction provides a unique and relevant career enhancement opportunity for classroom teachers and other interested professionals. The program is designed to provide academic and professional experiences that prepares leaders and scholars in the field of Curriculum and Instruction.

The 36 semester–hour M.Ed. program includes 18 hours of core courses, 12 hours of curriculum and instruction courses and 6 hours of specialization (Track 1 or Track 2) course work.

Admissions Requirements

To be considered for the fall admission to the M.Ed. program, applicants are required to submit the following materials to the Enrollment Office by July $15^{\rm th}$ of each year:

- A completed Graduate School Application
- Evidence of bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- Official transcripts of previous academic work attempted beyond high school
- A personal statement of purpose or intent for entering the program (500 words)
